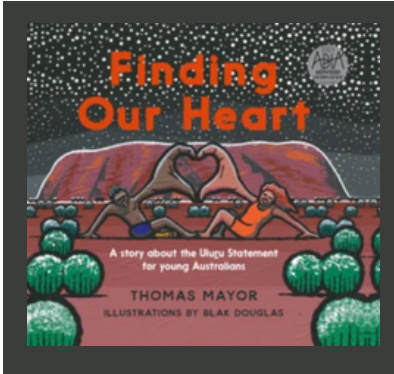


Finding Our Heart

Read

Discuss

Create

Invite each student to consider the question: what can we do now to help create a shared vision? Use the [activity template](#) to empower students to use words and illustrations to respond to this question.

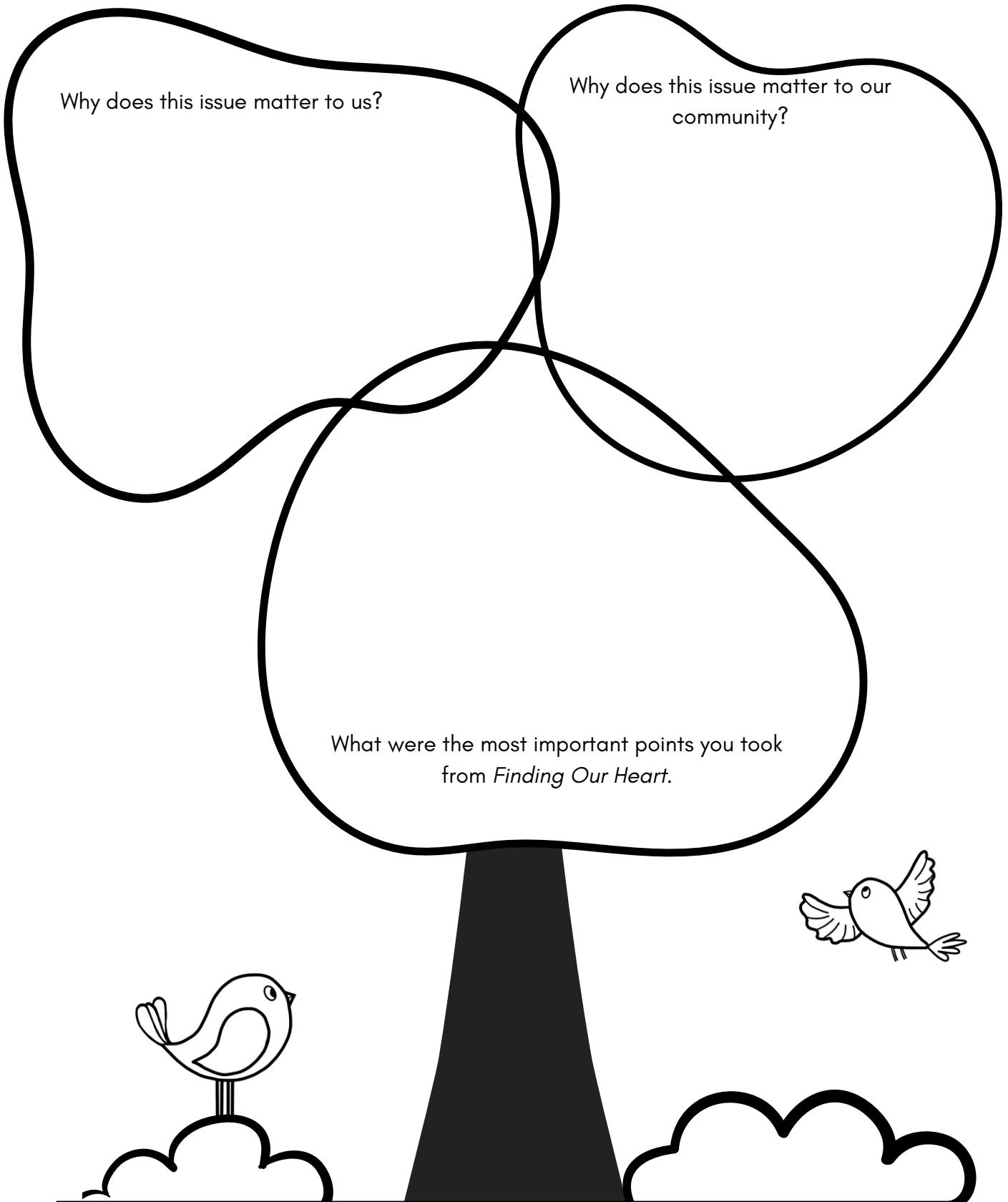
Act
