Heritage Value	The Museum of Australian Democracy (MoAD) is located in Old Parliament House – a National Heritage Listed building. National Heritage Listing is recognition that Old Parliament House is one of the most significant heritage buildings in Australia.

First Aid / Medical Emergencies	Is there a trained first aid officer at the Museum? Yes ⊠ No □ Is a first aid room available within the Museum? Yes ⊠ No □ MoAD has qualified First Aid Officers and first aid rooms to attend to an injured or ill person and utilises the ACT Ambulance Service. The Canberra Hospital in Garran is a ten-minute drive from the Museum. First aid for students should, in the first instance, be administered by an accompanying teacher. A Security Guard First Aid Officer can assist in the absence of a first aid qualified teacher or if additional assistance is required. A first aid room is available on the lower floor. Food and drink cannot be consumed in the Museum, if there is a medical reason for any student to require food or water during their scheduled program time, please alert the presenter.			
Building Emergencies	 Are emergency procedures in place at the Museum? Yes ⊠ No □ Emergency evacuation procedures are managed by trained staff and tested regularly. Program presenters are trained in emergency procedures. In the event of an emergency, a siren will be activated. Students, teachers and accompanying adults will be required to follow instructions from clearly identifiable Wardens located throughout the building and evacuate as directed.

Programs	All programs are booked and facilitated by museum staff. Please check our <u>website</u> for details. All school visitors and presenters wear white cotton gloves for the duration of the program.			
Working With Children	All staff and volunteers working with children and young adults have relevant police checks and hold ACT Government Working with Vulnerable People registration.			
Access	Is the Museum wheelchair accessible? Yes ⊠ No □ Detailed access information is available on our <u>website</u> . Courtesy wheelchairs are available. Mobility scooters may be used in the museum. An accessible toilet is located on the lower level near the Schools Orientation Space, as well as on the Main Floor. A Social Narrative is available on our <u>website</u> . A sensory box is available upon request for students who may require it to support their access to the museum.			
Toilets	Toilet facilities in the building are limited. We recommend allowing sufficient time before or after the program to use the toilet blocks in the adjoining Old Parliament House Rose Gardens.			
Cloaking	Cloaking facilities are limited. All student bags, drink bottles, food, hats, and large electronic devices including tablets need to be left on the bus. Teachers and accompanying adults can bring in medical kits and small bags, these need to be carried at all times. Cameras and phones may be brought into the building.			
Photography and Filming	MoAD is open to the public as a tourist attraction. As such, visitors will often take photographs. Teachers should abide by any guidelines their school has on photography or filming of students in public spaces. Photography is permitted in all areas of the Museum except in designated exhibition spaces. Filming of the program is not permitted.			
Duty of Care/ Student Behaviour	Duty of care requires that all students must be accompanied by a teacher or responsible adult associated with the school at all times while in the Museum. A teacher or adult should accompany students when using the toilets. Please bring sufficient staff to ensure that supervision is possible. A ratio of one adult to fifteen students is recommended however some programs require a different ratio, please refer to our <u>website</u> for further details.

	All teachers and adults accompanying the school group are responsible for the behaviour of students in their care. Teachers and accompanying adults are to ensure that student behaviour is respectful of museum content, heritage features and other museum visitors.				
Payment / PACER	Invoicing of all school groups will occur post visit based on the number of students who attended the program on the day. Learning staff will check and enter final numbers for PACER into the Book Canberra Excursions portal for each visiting group as they present for their program.				
Other Requirements	No special clothing is required. However, non-slip, sensible shoes are encouraged to both lessen the risk of injury and avoid damage to the heritage carpets and floor. In winter months we recommend a jacket as protection against cold weather when outside the building. View our <u>MoAD Learning COVID-19 Safety Plan</u> . Hand Sanitiser is available throughout the museum. If an adult or student is unwell, they must not visit the museum.
